Bible Story Focus: I spy someone who made everything.

Paul Teaches in Athens • Acts 17:16-34

Memory Verse: "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the

Christ, the Son of God." John 20:31, NLV **Key Question:** Who can believe in Jesus?

Bottom Line: I can believe in Jesus.

Basic Truth: Jesus wants to be my friend forever.

Make it Fun

Activities to help kids transition into the classroom and set up the bible story

.-Play travel

Make it True

Captivate kids with a bible story and help them understand how it connects to their world.

-Large group time

Make it Stick

Activities and crafts that help kids personalize the story and apply the truths to their life.

First 15 min - MAKE IT FUN

1. Play travel

Made to Play: An activity that encourages preschoolers to follow guidelines while having fun and learning new concepts

What You Need: several toy cars enough for each child to have their own

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Place the cars in the activity area.

During the Activity: Allow the children to pick and play only one car. Encourage the children to drive the cars to different places around the room. Repeat several times.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Let's drive!"

During the Activity: "Use the cars to drive to places. Let's see how many places we can drive too."

After the Activity: "Paul traveled to a city to tell others about Jesus. Let's get ready to hear our true story from the Bible!"

Transition: Move to Bible story time by pretending to drive a car on the way to the story area.

Large group - MAKE IT TRUE (snack)

What You Need: This month's worship song, "I Spy."

LEADER: "Hi, friends! This summer, we're learning that **[Bottom Line]** I can believe in **Jesus! Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line]** I can believe in **Jesus**, always. I spy Jesus. He's the best friend ever. Sing this with me!

Lead children in singing "I Spy," this month's worship song.

"Yes! [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus because He's the best friend ever! Tell me, who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus."

Last 20 min- MAKE IT STICK

1. Walk the Path

Hear from God | Memory Verse Review

Made to Move: An activity that uses a preschooler's natural desire to move to help them learn

What You Need: Floor tape

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Create a pathway around the activity area with the floor tape.

During the Activity: Encourage the children to walk one by one (while the others wait at their seat) and say the memory verse. Repeat several times.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Look, a pathway in our classroom!"

During the Activity: "It's like the path that Paul took when he went to the city. Let's walk on the path and say our memory verse together."

After the Activity: "Awesome work! We can all be like Paul and teach others about Jesus. We can all believe in Jesus. Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus!"

2. Animals

Live for God | Application Activity

Made to Move: An activity that uses a preschooler's natural desire to move to help them learn

What You Need: No supplies needed.

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Have the children stand in front of you. Making sure there is space inbetween each child.

During the Activity: Invite the children to pretend to be the following animals: cow (on all fours and moo), bear (claw and growl), monkey (pretend to climb a tree and make monkey sounds), bird (flap arms and tweet), and dog (on all fours and bark). Repeat as desired.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "God made the animals. God made everything!"

During the Activity: "Let's pretend to be animals! Let's pretend to be a cow. Let's crawl and say, 'Moo.' (Demonstrate.) You are awesome cows! Now, let's be bears. Stand up and claw. Let me hear you GROWL! Nice job! Let's pretend to be monkeys!" (Continue with all of the animals.)

After the Activity: "That was awesome! God made the animals. God made everything! We can all believe in Jesus. Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus!"

3. Teach

Made to Move: An activity that uses a preschooler's natural desire to move to help them learn

What You Need: No supplies needed.

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Have the children sit in their chairs.

During the Activity: Encourage the children to teach each other about themselves. Have the children tell each other the following things (they may stand up when its their turn):

- Favorite color
- Favorite food
- What they like to do outside
- If they have a pet
- If they have brothers and sisters
- Favorite ice cream
- Favorite animal
- What they like to do with their family
- Favorite thing to do at church
- Favorite TV show

Be sure each child has a turn to teach others about themselves.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Let's get to know each other today. We're going to be teachers and teach others about ourselves."

During the Activity: "First, let's teach each other what our favorite color is. (Pause.) Great job! I love learning all about you! Next, let's teach each other what our favorite food is. (Pause.) Yum! You all have wonderful favorite foods! Now, let's teach each other what we like to do when we go outside." (Continue and finish activity.)

After the Activity: "That was so much fun! Today, we'll hear a Bible story about a man who went to a city to teach people all about Jesus!"
