WELCOME

Host has lots of energy as he or she welcomes everyone to [Name of Environment]. Host is relatable and inviting. Host can talk about something that happened culturally throughout the week like a big sports game (Masters Golf Tournament), movie opening (*The Super Mario Bros. Movie*), a viral video on YouTube, etc. Host tells them how excited he or she is that they're there and briefly runs through what they can expect. This is especially helpful for first-time guests to make them feel like they know what's happening.

OPENER

HOST: "Greetings! We're so glad to see all of you made it to [Name of Environment]. At [Name of Church], we realize life is busy, and you don't have to be here. But you are! We have an incredible day ready for you. So let's jump in!

"For the entire month of April, we will be digging into one of the most appetizing subjects—gardening! Everyone knows one of the most essential skills to cultivating a lush garden is identifying, sorting, and storing your seeds! This skill helps one to achieve the highest level of quality and yield! Today we've got some great news. According to the Planter's Almanac, you are at the PERFECT age to test your knowledge of garden seeds. In fact, I want to play a game called Garden Chops!

SLIDE: GARDEN CHOPS!

"I need four brave volunteers who know a thing or two about seeds! Any knowledgeable volunteers? (Allow response)

Host selects four volunteers to come to the stage. Host splits kids into teams of two and positions both teams on opposite sides of the stage.

“To play Garden Chops, we’ll display an image of a seed on the screen. If one of our volunteers recognizes the seed, you must rush to the table in the center of the stage. On the table, you’ll notice a bounty of vegetables. The first team to hold up the correct vegetable will be awarded a point. If you guess incorrectly, the other team gets a free guess! The team with the most points at the end will be the Garden Chops Champion! Any questions? (Allow response) Great! Let’s play!

AUDIO: UPBEAT GAME MUSIC

SLIDE: GARDEN CHOPS SEED SLIDES

Host facilitates Garden Chops. Images should be displayed one at a time until the correct vegetable has been selected. Vegetables and fruit could be mixed to include screen and non-screen related veggies and fruit such as bell pepper, zucchini, tomato, watermelon, lettuce, carrot, apple, orange, etc.

“Wow! Wow! Wow! Our volunteers displayed some great veggie recognition! Who would have thought lettuce seeds would have looked like that? Despite both team’s best effort, there can only be one Garden Chops Champion! Let’s give a rowdy round of applause to our winning team! (Allow Loud Response)

“We’re so excited our favorite Worship Leader [Name of Worship Leader] is here to lead us in praising God. Let’s make some noise as we get ready to worship our amazing God!”

Host exits as Worship Leader enters.

WORSHIP LEADER: “Yes! It’s the highlight of my week getting to sing praises with all of you. On this beautiful spring day, we have so much to sing about and celebrate. There’s nobody like Jesus. He’s the best friend ever! Let’s start off giving our praise to God for the friend we have in Jesus. Come on!”

“Yeah, so good! Every part of God’s story is about love—God’s love for US. As we read in John 3:16: ‘God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son. Anyone who believes in him will not die but will have eternal life.’ (NIV) We know God loved us enough to send Jesus for us. Let’s sing and worship God together.”

COMMUNICATOR SCRIPT (STORY)

SLIDE: THEME BACKGROUND

Communicator enters as Worship Leaders exit.

INTRODUCTION

COMMUNICATOR: “Hey, friends! We’re really excited you are joining us today as we start a conversation on humility! It’s a big word many of us don’t use every day, but it is such an important word to embrace.

SLIDE: VIRTUE SLIDE

“We are defining humility as putting others first by giving up what you think you deserve.

Communicator tells a personal story about someone demonstrating humility. If possible, tell a story that involves vegetables or a community garden.

“When I hear this definition, I think of two things: my grandparents and their vegetables! As a child, I remember traveling out to the country to visit my grandparents each summer. You would’ve loved my grandparents. Granddad always told us the best jokes, while my grandmother always baked us her famous peanut butter cake!

“Behind my grandparent’s house, they grew a massive garden. My grandparents didn’t have a lot of money, and their garden provided food for them all year long! I remember seeing tomatoes, huge watermelons, corn stalks, green bean vines, onions, and potato plants. Those were just the vegetables I can remember, but I know their garden produce was much more sizeable than my memory.

“In the evenings, I remember sitting under their carport with all my cousins, aunts, uncles, and grandparents. Usually, someone was frying up some hush puppies and catfish while the whole family was shucking corn or hulling black-eyed peas. All the veggies would be bagged or jarred for my grandparents to eat later in the year. One thing always stuck with me. Whenever we left, my grandparents would always send bags of fresh veggies with us to carry home! Even though they could have used all of that produce for their own meals, they still thought about others and chose to share some food with us!”

TENSION

COMMUNICATOR: “How many of you have stories like mine where you’ve seen or experienced kindness like this? *(Allow response)* No doubt, every person here has their own story they could share if we had the time. Maybe your friends surprised you by coming to your soccer game and brought homemade posterboard signs to cheer you on! It could have been a teacher who took time out of her off period to eat lunch with you. Your brother might have spent part of his savings to buy you a birthday present! For many, we do not experience this kind of thoughtfulness every day.

“So many of your generation want to stand out in the world, and one way to do that is to live differently than everyone else! Acts of kindness, in the form of humility, stand out in contrast to what we often see and hear today. The news is filled with negative stories about the world’s problems. Social media accounts are centered on me, my experiences, and my possessions. In our classrooms at school, we all want our opinion to be heard even if it means talking over other people. Kind, thoughtful actions can easily get lost in the mix.”

“So what does it look like to live differently with humility? How can we live for others when others live for themselves? What could it look like to serve others instead of serving ourselves? These are great questions to ask and answer at your age!

“I’m so excited you are here! Today, we will look to answer a few of those questions by looking at Someone who did this better than anyone who’s ever lived! He went out of His way to care for others in ways that nobody else would do.”

TRUTH

COMMUNICATOR: “The man’s name is Jesus. If you’ve been around [Name of Environment] for any length of time, you’ve heard us talk about the perfect life of Jesus.

If you’re using a timeline of story images on the wall, reference it here.

“He took time to teach people truths about God in small, intimate settings and sometimes to large crowds. As Jesus traveled, He healed countless people who suffered from illness and disease.”

“Our story today is one of the most powerful examples of who Jesus is. It comes near the end of Jesus’ time on earth. We find Jesus traveling with His closest friends. They were all headed to Jerusalem for the Passover Feast. Passover was a huge party celebrating the time God rescued His chosen people from Pharaoh in Egypt—we talked about this earlier this school year!

“On their journey, the group took a break on the slope of the Mount of Olives just outside Jerusalem. At this time, Jesus gave a couple of His disciples some specific instructions. Jesus said,

Open the Bible to Matthew 21:2 (NirV) and read.

“Go to the village ahead of you. As soon as you get there, you will find a donkey tied up. Her colt will be with her. Untie them and bring them to me.”

“The men did just as Jesus requested. Using their coats as padding, the disciples made a comfortable seat on the back of the colt for Jesus to sit. As Jesus rode towards Jerusalem, He was fulfilling a prophecy spoken 500 years before. Zechariah stated the Messiah would enter the holy city in the humblest of ways—on the back a donkey’s colt. While most kings want to come across as all powerful and mighty, Jesus was riding a simple donkey, which indicated the kind of king Jesus intended to be. This demonstrated Jesus was a different kind of king—a king who came to serve others.

“Crowds of people heard that Jesus was approaching the city and began to gather. They took palm branches and laid them on the ground along with their coats. They did this to honor Jesus and worship Him! As Jesus passed, His colt stepped on coats and palm branches. The crowd walked before and behind Jesus shouting:

Open the Bible to John 12:13b (NirV) and read.

“Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the king of Israel!”

“Imagine the excitement in the crowd! It’s important to note the entire crowd was not thrilled about Jesus’ arrival. The religious leaders had been looking for a way to get rid of Jesus and saw their chance. Jesus knew

their plans, and He knew the time had come for Him to give up His life. But first, He needed to have one last meal with His disciples.”

Communicator pulls out carrots. Communicator invites six volunteers to the stage to hold two carrots each.

“The celebration of Passover included sitting down to eat a meal together. All of Jesus’ closest friends were gathered in preparation of the evening meal. As the food was being served, Jesus did something nobody was expecting.”

Communicator begins to call up the volunteers holding the carrots one at a time. Communicator carefully washes each carrot one at a time. As communicator washes the carrots, communicator continues to teach the following.

“I want you to imagine each of these carrots represent one of Jesus’ disciples. You might not know this, but for carrots to grow best, they need loose soil full of organic matter! Some of the best fertilizers for carrots are made from compost, which is decomposing or rotting plants mixed with chicken manure! This is a great reason to always wash your carrots! Even if they don’t look dirty, it’s better to play it safe —wash off the dirt.

“Like these carrots, Jesus’ disciples had really dirty feet. They lived each day barefoot or wearing sandals. Their journeys would have taken them through sand, dirt, rock, mud, and manure! Their feet were not washed every day and would have been extra ‘ripe.’ Needless to say, their feet would have been a chore to clean. Traditionally, a household servant would wash the feet of guests upon entry into the home. However, Jesus opted to do the job. Jesus took a towel, poured water into a basin, and began to clean the feet of the disciples. He used the towel to dry off their feet after He cleaned them.

Communicator collects the carrots and dismisses the volunteers back to their seats.

“Peter was the first to speak up and asked if Jesus was going to wash his feet. Jesus responded and said,

Open the Bible to John 13:7 (NirV) and read.

“‘You don’t realize now what I am doing. But later you will understand.’

“Peter was confused by Jesus’ actions. He even refused to let Jesus wash his feet. But Jesus answered,

Open the Bible to John 13:8b (NirV) and read.

“‘Unless I wash you, you can’t share life with me.

“Eventually Jesus washed all the feet in the room, including Peter’s! Once Jesus returned to His seat at the table, Jesus addressed His friends by saying,

Open the Bible to John 13:12b-15 (NirV) and read.

“‘Do you understand what I have done for you?’ he asked them. You call me ‘Teacher’ and ‘Lord.’ You are right. That is what I am. I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet. So, you also should wash one another’s feet. I have given you an example. You should do as I have done for you.”

APPLICATION

COMMUNICATOR: “Today is Palm Sunday. It is a day we remember Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where the crowds hailed Him as their king! But it’s important to notice the unassuming nature Jesus, the Son of God, had as He entered the city—on the back of a donkey colt. I love how we got to continue further into the story to see Jesus eating a meal with His disciples. Instead of the house servant cleaning the guests’ feet, Jesus, the Messiah, did the job. He had all the rights and all the power in Heaven to demand that His disciples wash HIS feet. But He didn’t. By washing their feet, Jesus showed them all what it looked like to put others first!

SLIDE: GOD’S BIG STORY TIMELINE

SLIDE: WEEK 1 TIMELINE IMAGE

If you’re making a timeline of printed images on your wall, take this moment to place today’s timeline image on the clothesline.

“Do you want to know what’s really crazy? We can be like Jesus! We can make the decision every day to put aside what we want in order to show love to others! I’m not saying you need to wash your baseball team’s feet after the game, but you can always figure out a way to be humble and give up what you want for others.

“Humility is way of looking at how you approach your life. It’s humbling yourself and looking for different ways to put others first. You might spend a few extra minutes helping your coach clean out the dugout after the game. Or you can invite your mom to go relax after a long day while you clean up the kitchen. You could even pause your video game to help your little sister learn her math facts.

“If you take time to look around you each day, you’ll find tons of opportunities to live like Jesus and to put others first. This isn’t an easy task, but nobody ever said following Jesus would be!”

LANDING

COMMUNICATOR: “Each one of us have been blessed with adults who take the time to put us first. It could have been a teacher, our parents, or someone in our family. As we prepare to move into our Small Groups, we want you to think on this one question:

SLIDE: KEY QUESTION

“When has someone put you first?” It could have been for your birthday, a month ago at school, or today on your drive to [Name of Environment]. Get excited because you are about to have some great conversations with your Small Group Leaders. Before we leave, let’s end this Palm Sunday by praying together!”

Communicator leads group in a prayer related to what they just heard. After prayer, Communicator dismisses kids to Small Group.

- To play Garden Chops, set up a table center stage. Direct both groups of volunteers to stand an equal distance away from the center table. On the table, place a variety of fruit and vegetables all over the table. It's important to have only ONE of each variety. Display a seed image (included) and allow one person from each team to rush to the center table to be the first to hold up the correct fruit or vegetable. The team who correctly identifies the produce gets the point. Consider playing the best of five rounds. Buckets could be used for teams to place their correctly guessed veggies inside after each round.

GETTING READY

For a list of PROs in your part of the world: www.iamusic.com. Look at the copyright on the CD or sheet music to discover the PRO or publisher of the song. It is up to you to make sure your church has permission to perform or play a recording of a song.

- Communicator will call up six volunteers and hand each person two carrots. Volunteers will stand behind Communicator until they are called up for the carrot to get washed in the bucket. The bucket should be placed center stage so the audience gets the best view of Communicator washing the carrots. If they're not super dirty, use extra dirt or potting soil to to dirty the carrots before kids enter the room.

VIDEO ENHANCEMENTS FOR YOUR ENVIRONMENT
