GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN JOY AND GOD'S CHARACTER, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY

Choose joy! This may be a commonly used phrase you've heard, but what does it *actually* mean? Joy is more than being excited about the good things that happen to us. Joy is an attitude—a decision to trust God no matter what is going on in our lives. From the very beginning, God had a plan for the world. As we dive into the Bible, we'll discover God's plan for us and how God has been at work through it all. When we see and celebrate what God is doing, we can find true joy!

CORE INSIGHT: The theological foundation for JOY

Faith in God's Son. I believe in Jesus and will continually trust Him even when life doesn't make sense.

Jesus never promises that life will be easy or perfect, even when we follow Him. Though we may experience hurt and see pain all around us, God is still at work. Because of Jesus, we can experience a relationship with God and learn how to trust God no matter what.

JOY is choosing to celebrate what God is doing.

HEADS UP: IDEAS TO KEEP IN MIND AS YOU TALK ABOUT JOY WITH KIDS

As you talk about joy this month, keep in mind that kids are concrete thinkers and need a solid starting point before they dive into bigger concepts and ideas. Kids may naturally equate joy with their circumstances or with their possessions . . . which can cause those who don't have as much to feel out of place or feel badly about themselves and their family. This is an opportunity to help kids see how joy is about more than the things we have. Explain how you can have joy whether you're having a good day or a bad day because God gave us Jesus. Guide the conversation to help kids find joy because of what God has done in their lives or in the life of someone they know.

Be sensitive to those kids or volunteers in your environment who may be experiencing more acute mental health-related illnesses. Clinical depression, anxiety, or PTSD will make it more difficult for people to experience joy or identify how God is at work. Enter those conversations with a posture of listening and encouragement. Don't rush in and try to fix anything with a quick answer or Bible verse. Connect with families impacted in this way and find out the best way you can help. And if your environment turns out to be the first point of contact for this family's experience, be sure to have a plan to connect that family to the help they need to ensure the child's safety.

TODAY'S SUGGESTED SCHEDULE

WEEK 4

Key Question: When is it hard to find joy? Kids are facing a lot of hard things these days—so much so that it can be difficult for them to find joy. As our kids discover more about our true source of joy—our relationship with God—we hope that they'll begin to discover different ways to look for joy in what they see and experience each day.

In week 4, we take a look at some of David's Psalms—specifically, **Psalms 8, 16, and 19**. David wrote a lot about the things he observed in nature and the world around him that God had created. Through creation, we notice how God is at work—even if sometimes we struggle to see God's work in our own lives. Joy is all around us. We just have to look.

Bottom Line: Find joy in what you see around you. God has given us the amazing ability to use our senses so we can find joy through the beauty of God's creation. When kids tap into these senses, they can discover God in a whole new way. Even if not all of our senses work perfectly, we can find ways to see how God is at work in the world around us.

WELCOME

Host has lots of energy as he or she welcomes everyone to [Name of Environment]. Host is relatable and inviting. Host can talk about something that happened culturally throughout the week like a big sports game (Wimbledon, Summer Olympics), holiday (4th of July), movie opening (Despicable Me 4, Mufasa: The Lion King), a viral video on YouTube, etc. Host tells them how excited he or she is that they're there and briefly runs through what they can expect. This is especially helpful for first-time guests to make them feel like they know what's happening.

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, hey, everybody! Do me a favor. Look around the room and see who all made it today! (Pause) You are surrounded by some of the finest people I know! And because you were able to be here, it seems right to officially start the party! Welcome to [Name of Environment]! For those who are new, my name is [Name of Host]."

"And if I can be honest with you, I'm surprised you made it today with the odd cold snap we experienced this morning. When I woke up, I was expecting our typical late-July, clammy weather. I did not check the forecast when I went to bed, and I certainly did not expect the freezing temperatures we received last night. Did anybody else receive freezing weather? (Pause) No? Huh. Well, I did, and it has completely ruined my plans.

"Originally, I planned to emphasize the importance of your party outfit. Everybody knows you want your fit to match the theme of the party, right? Or at the very least, not match the same outfit with someone else going to the same party. That'd be horrible.

WORSHIP

Worship Leaders enter as Host exits.

WORSHIP LEADER: "Hi, everyone! I am so ready to worship God with you today. Anytime we get to unite our voices together in praise, it's the best sound ever. Our God is amazing. Let's sing and worship God now.

AUDIO: "SING YOUR PRAISE" / TRACK 2 FROM MY LIFE FOR YOU

OPTIONAL VIDEO: "SING YOUR PRAISE" LIVE LYRICS OR DANCE MOVES MUSIC VIDEO

"That's right—we will celebrate and sing praise to our God. Before we continue in worship, check this out.

"Our joy in life comes from God. That's why we can sing praise to God no matter what's going on around us. Let's sing this song with joy in our hearts. Here we go!

"Listen to these words from Psalm 100:1-3: 'Shout for joy to the LORD, everyone on earth. Worship the LORD with gladness. Come to him with songs of joy. Know that the LORD is God. He made us, and we belong to him.' (NirV) That's such an important reminder. God made us. God's love for us is so great. It's always there for us, no matter what. Think about that today as we sing this song of worship."

COMMUNICATOR SCRIPT (STORY)

SLIDE: THEME BACKGROUND

Communicator enters as the Worship Leader exits.

Several helium-filled balloons, on strings, and weighted at the bottom, are placed around the stage.

INTRODUCTION

COMMUNICATOR: “Hey, everybody! Thanks for showing up today. For the last several weeks, we have talked a *lot* about parties. We’ve discussed different types, foods, planning, the works—and today, I want you to brainstorm about something similar.

“Imagine the best party ever. No budget, you can have anything you want there: food, chocolate fountains, an ice sculpture of your favorite animal, whatever you want.

“Maybe you’re a giant inflatable unicorn dance floor kind of person. Maybe you’re a bounce house filled with Pez kind of person. Whichever you are, dream big! What would your perfect party look like? Find someone near you and talk about it for a moment!

Give kids a minute to discuss the ultimate party.

“Let’s break this down! First, food. What’s the ultimate food to have at your ultimate party?

Call on a few volunteers to share their ideas for the ultimate food—and write one of the suggestions on one of the balloons with a black permanent marker.

“Not bad, not bad. What about activities? What are the ultimate activities you could do at your ultimate party?

Again, take a few ideas from the Large Group—and write one of the suggestions on one of the balloons with a black permanent marker.

“Perfect, perfect. And who would be there? At this insane party of yours? Who would you invite?

Again, take a few ideas from the Large Group—and write one of the suggestions on one of the balloons with a black permanent marker.

“Whoa, lots of people. I like it. What about a theme? How would it be themed or decorated?

Take a few ideas from the Large Group—and write one of the suggestions on one of the balloons with a black permanent marker.

“Ooh, fancy. I’m loving this party more and more. Lastly . . . what to drink? And how to drink it? “Fountain? Swimming pool? Fire hose?

For the final time, take a few ideas from the Large Group—and write one of the suggestions on one of the balloons with a black permanent marker.

"Wow, that's crazy. (re-read each suggestion from the balloons to describe the party) This party would be bonkers."

TENSION

COMMUNICATOR: "If we were to have a party like these balloons describe, it could quite possibly be the best party ever, of all time! Nobody in this room would want to miss it.

"To pull off a great party like this, we would need to plan out a few more details, secure the funding, reserve the location and, from the looks of your suggestions, call the fire department and have a few helicopters on standby. Not saying it can't be done . . . but it'd take some time. So we'd have to wait a while.

"Waiting can be hard! Nobody wants to wait, right? And it seems like we're waiting all the time for all kinds of things: for the latest and greatest video game to drop, for vacation to arrive, for the Pizza Rolls to be done in the oven . . . I bet a lot of us don't even let the microwave count all the way down to zero before whipping open the door to grab our Hot Pockets.

"I've never met someone who loves to sit and wait for things.

"I do have a question, though. Is it possible to still be happy in the middle of the waiting, even though something hasn't happened yet? I mean, can you still be excited the entire time while waiting for something, or does it wear off? Do you stop caring? Or maybe it's just not as exciting as first hearing or thinking about it?

"Many would say happiness, or enjoyment, or joy isn't possible over something that's yet to come. I wonder, though, if that's actually true. Today we'll explore something God *will* do—something that hasn't happened yet—but is promised to happen in the future.

"And we'll find out if it's possible to be excited until it comes to pass!"

Move over next to the overhead projector, already set up. Near the projector are silhouetted cutouts to be used throughout the Truth section when prompted. NOTE: if you don't have an overhead projector, tape these to your focal wall or draw them on a whiteboard.

TRUTH

COMMUNICATOR: "Fun fact, the Bible is made up of 66 books.

Place the book cutout on the overhead projector.

"The first 65 books tell the whole beginning and the entire middle of God's Big Story. It shows us that in the beginning, God created a perfect world, meant to be a paradise. All of that changed when people turned away from God. From the fruit and the tree and the serpent, God's plan was set into motion. People needed to restore their relationship with God, and God was going to make that happen through a Rescuer.

Remove the previous cutout and place a cross cutout on the overhead projector.

“God’s Son, Jesus, came to earth and lived a life without sin. When He died, Jesus paid the debt for everyone’s sins, effectively restoring our relationship with God. News of Jesus began to spread by those who believed in Jesus to far-reaching places. Groups of believers, thousands upon thousands of people, began forming churches across the globe.

Remove the previous cutout and place a globe cutout on the overhead projector.

“Currently, we are living in the middle of God’s story. We weren’t there at the beginning, and we haven’t seen the end yet! The story of Jesus, even today, continues to spread . . . now to millions of people. Every day, people are still learning that God loves them and desires to have a relationship with them. That relationship is made possible through Jesus, God’s Son!

“And although the end of God’s story hasn’t happened yet, we actually do know a bit about the outcome. The very last book of the Bible, Revelation, tells us about the end. And I’ll be honest—it’s kind of a bizarre book. When you first read it, it’s full of imagery, strange descriptions, huge timelines, and cryptic numbers, and it can sometimes be hard to interpret or understand.

“Today I’ll hopefully explain it in a way that you’ll get!

“The book of Revelation was written by one of Jesus’ friends—some would say even His closest friend. His name was John. He was a professional fisherman until Jesus invited John to follow Him.

Remove the previous cutout and place a boat cutout on the overhead projector.

“Having experienced Jesus’ ministry, miracles, and love of people firsthand, John was a sold-out, to-the-core believer in Jesus. After Jesus ascended to Heaven, John wrote five New Testament books, with Revelation being one of them. Revelation was written as a letter to seven churches in Asia. At the time this letter was written, John was living on the island of Patmos, a small island in the Aegean Sea off the coast of Turkey. He was sent there as a prisoner for talking about Jesus. Although John was not stuck behind bars, he was trapped on the island.

Remove the previous cutout and place an island cutout on the overhead projector.

“However, while he was in exile, John continued to talk with God. One day, the Holy Spirit gave John a vision of what was to come. It terrified him, and if it happened to you or me, we’d be terrified, too. John heard a loud voice like a trumpet.

Remove the previous cutout and place a trumpet cutout on the overhead projector.

“Jesus Himself appeared. Jesus said,

Open the Bible to Revelation 1:11 and read.

“‘Write on a scroll what you see. Send it to the seven churches in Asia Minor.’

“So, John did exactly that. He grabbed a scroll and started writing. Special messages came to John about things that were going to happen. The words, the descriptions, and the prophecies that John wrote make up the book of Revelation.

“And like I said, some of what John saw was terrifying. Other visions were magnificent. Much of the book is hard to understand. However, one part of the vision that John wrote about was pretty exciting! This is some of what John saw. John heard a voice say:

Remove the previous cutout and place a home cutout on the overhead projector.

Open the Bible to Revelation 21:3b-4 and read.

“Look! God now makes his home with the people. He will live with them. They will be his people. And God himself will be with them and be their God. “He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death.” And there will be no more sadness. There will be no more crying or pain. Things are no longer the way they used to be.’

“Friends, it’s a new home. A new place. With God. No pain. No hunger, or sadness, or crying—all a thing of the past. All wars, conflicts, arguments, strife, depression, all of it . . . gone. How great is that? Our great God will bring all the comfort and peace and harmony and love possible! John’s vision continued,

Remove the previous cutout and place a cityscape cutout on the overhead projector.

Open the Bible and read Revelation 22:3-5.

“There will no longer be any curse. The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city. God’s servants will serve him. They will see his face. His name will be on their foreheads. There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun. The Lord God will give them light. They will rule forever and ever.

“Now, it can be difficult for us to imagine ‘forever.’ It might be difficult for us to imagine what life would be like with no nighttime or darkness of any kind. Or to have God’s name on our foreheads. Maybe a sticker? How does that work?

“Kidding aside, just imagine it. No more darkness. No more curse. We’ll see God’s face, and light will reign—a life with God without end, and life won’t be boring. We’ll get to continue working with God to care for creation. Our talents and gifts will be used by God!

“I don’t know about you . . . but that’s pretty exciting. Even if it hasn’t happened yet!”

Communicator removes the previous cutout and places a chair/throne cutout on the overhead projector.

APPLICATION

COMMUNICATOR: “The ending of God’s story is complex and difficult to imagine or even picture. The truth is that no one really knows what it’s going to be like.

“We don’t have it all figured out. But what we do know, or what John tells us in Revelation, gets me excited. We know who wins the final battle. We know that light beats darkness. Ultimately, God will reign supreme in the end! He will remove all that is wrong. No longer will we have to endure the stuff that makes us feel sick or sad or worried or scared! Instead, God will make everything right!

Communicator turns off the overhead projector.

“But the end of God’s story has not happened yet. It can seem far away. All of us are still living in a broken world where we face difficult situations. Each day, we face chores, homework, conflict, bullies, and sickness, and the list goes on. However, God is still at work in the world on our hardest days—even though we can’t see God.

“When we follow Jesus, we know that this is not the end. In fact, Paul once wrote,

Open the Bible to 1 Corinthians 2:9 and read.

*“No eye has seen,
no ear has heard,
and no human mind has known.
God has prepared these things for those who love him.*

“That means God is preparing something that will be beyond our imagination for longer than we can even comprehend for those of us who believe and follow Jesus!”

LANDING

COMMUNICATOR: “And in the end, our place in the story will be amazing—it will be with God! All the things you love here on earth will be made brand-new. You may enjoy your talents and interests even more in Heaven! Regardless, it will be a party—a party bigger than anything, anywhere, ever.

“As you head to your Small Groups, think about this:

SLIDE: KEY QUESTION

“What’s the best party you can imagine? We talked about this at the beginning—just take a look at the balloons. Now that you’ve heard a bit about how it’s going to be with God, maybe you might want to think a little bigger! You’ll have a chance to talk more about this with your Small Groups in just a moment. But first, let’s pray and thank God for giving us a glimpse into the victorious end of the story. God has given us a reason to celebrate!”

Communicator leads group in a prayer related to what they just heard. After prayer, Communicator dismisses kids to Small Group.

AUDIO: PLAY HIGH-ENERGY MUSIC AS THE KIDS EXIT.

- Before the kids arrive, dampen all the clothing. Wring the clothing of all excess water. Place the clothing flat and not touching in a freezer. If the clothing is too wet, it will be virtually impossible for the leaders to quickly put on the frozen clothing. Test the clothing the week before to make sure the game will work.
- Keep the clothing in the freezer or in a cooler until the very last minute. Prepare three containers: one container for each of the contestants with each of the three articles of clothing (shirt, hat, socks).

WHAT YOU DO:
